Dear Health Plan Administrators,

On August 3, 2023 OMH notified Mainstream Medicaid Managed Care Plans, HARPs, HIV SNPs, and MAP Plans (collectively referred to as "MMCPs" herein) of increases to mental health outpatient service rates to reflect a legislatively mandated Minimum Wage Increase and a four percent COLA effective January 1, 2023 and April 1, 2023 respectively. This memorandum is being sent to alert MMCPs that DOB approved the following rate(s) change(s):

## Table 1:

Rate Increase	Effective Date	DOB Approval Date
Minimum Wage Increase	January 1, 2023	November 17, 2023
COLA	April 1, 2023	August 24, 2023

Per Chapter 57 of the Laws of 2022, MMCPs are required to pay claims based on the effective date of the rate changes. As a result, MMCPs must complete necessary systems edits to ensure payable claims for applicable OMH programs and dates of service are reimbursed at the rate increases identified in Table 1 above. Additionally, MMCPs are required to conduct retrospective reconciliation to adjust payments for clean claims as necessary. MMCPs must complete these activities as soon as possible but no later than 90 days from the date of DOB approval.
