## Introduction

The New York State Office of Mental Health's County Capacity Utilization and Data Book for Calendar Years 2013-2014 includes inpatient and community-based psychiatric service utilization and capacity statistics displayed at the statewide, region and county levels. Separate tables are used to display utilization of inpatient services by inpatient provider county of location and by patient county of residence. Inpatient and outpatient service capacity and utilization are displayed for the adult (18 and older) and child (under 18) populations where appropriate. Service utilization based on per capita rates from US Census 2013 population estimates are also included.<sup>1</sup>

The data presented come from a number of administrative data sources; e.g., CONCERTS, ICR, PCS, Medicaid, MHARS, and SPARCS.<sup>2</sup> Data limitations are described below.

### *Data Limitations:*

- First and foremost is the timeliness of the data. Average daily census (ADC) data is based on 2013 information whereas capacity is as of October 2014. ADC is also reported by the patient's county of residence. For these two reasons, ADC can exceed capacity; for example, see adult data for Niagara and Chenango counties in Table 1.
- Service use in the community (Tables 9-14) is reported by county of program location so planners can see where services are located. However, program service areas may extend beyond county borders. A county relatively rich in

outpatient services for example, may serve both its residents and those of a neighboring county.

- Because clinics are not licensed for specific slot capacities, size is measured by estimated total persons served annually. For clinics, Tables 10 and 13 include data from the following sources:
  - Medicaid-enrolled adults and children receiving clinic services.
  - Medicaid and non-Medicaid adults and children receiving State-operated clinic services.
  - The estimated annual count of non-Medicaid adult and children served in non-State clinics from the 2013 OMH Patient Characteristics Survey (PCS).
- Inpatient capacity (Tables 1, 3, 5 and 7) may include off-line beds due to staffing shortages, reconstruction or other reasons and may therefore be over-reported.

### **Glossary of Terms**

---

<b>Average Daily Census (ADC)</b>	ADC calculation is based on the total length of stay in a hospital for all patients divided by 365.
<b>Inpatient treatment</b>	Includes Residential Treatment Facilities (RTFs), state psychiatric center inpatient units, licensed private hospitals or hospitals for the mentally ill, and psychiatric units in general hospitals.
<b>Community-based services</b>	All outpatient programs, including emergency services, licensed outpatient, housing and support programs. Excludes prison-based forensic units.
<b>CONCERTS</b>	Certificate of Need Certification System (CONCERTS) data are collected by the OMH Bureau of Inspection and Certification (BIC) from local service providers that are licensed and/or funded by OMH.
<b>ICR</b>	Institutional Cost Report.
<b>Medicaid</b>	Department of Health (DOH) Medicaid Claims Database.
<b>MHARS</b>	OMH's Mental Health Automated Recordkeeping System (i.e., EMR) for State-operated Hospitals. Data does not include forensic units, Sex Offender Treatment Programs or Research Programs.
<b>PCS</b>	The Patient Characteristic Survey (PCS) is conducted biannually in all OMH-funded or licensed mental health programs. Providers report client-level demographic, clinical, social and diagnostic information for all clients served during the last week in October of the survey year.
<b>SPARCS</b>	DOH's Statewide Planning and Research Cooperative System (SPARCS). This system gathers health care industry data on patient characteristics, diagnoses, treatments and services.
